Some Ask? -

What exactly are the 'rules' for the number of times a person can receive Holy Communion in one day?

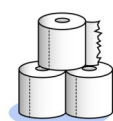
This is actually given to us in Canon Law, canon 917. The canon says,
“A person who has already received the Most Holy Eucharist can
receive it a second time on the same day only within the Eucharistic
celebration in which the person participates.” The exception would be
for Holy Viaticum as noted in canon 921, §2, “Even if they have been
nourished by holy communion on the same day, however, those in
danger of death are strongly urged to receive communion again.”
Another exception would be for a priest who has permission to trinate.
The simple answer is twice in normal circumstances, as long as the
person participated in Holy Mass the second time. This would prevent
someone from coming to the minister and requesting Holy
Communion outside of Mass after they had already received Holy
Communion once that day. This underscores the clear principle of the
Church that Holy Communion, under normal circumstances, ought to
be received within the context of Holy Mass. One commentary on this
canon goes on to say that the purpose of this law also is “to prevent
the abuse of receiving multiple communions out of superstition,
ignorance, or misguided devotion.

(New Commentary on the Code of Canon Law, 1112).

Sacrament of Penance

Wednesday ~ 6:00 - 7:00 pm; or by appointment.

Sacrament of the Sick

Anointing of the Sick should be given if an individual is gravely ill or near
death. If possible, the Sacrament should also be administered before
major surgery or when one is initially hospitalized.

Sacrament of Holy Matrimony

Diocesan policy requires 12 months of preparation for Marriage. Contact
the parish as soon as possible after engagement. No arrangements should
be made prior to consultation with the pastor.

Sacrament of Baptism

Parents must be registered members of the parish and attend a
Baptism preparation class prior to the Baptism if this is your first child
baptized. Requirements for godparents are established by the
Catholic Church. Please call the parish office for Information and
to register your child for Baptism.

All Catholics should be registered in their local parish. Please
contact the parish office to obtain registration forms, or if you
are uncertain of the parish where you should register.
