

Brief History

In the picturesque valley at St. Ignatius Loyola Catholic Church, just 21 years after the end of the Civil War, local farmers and parishioners began what is now known as the Buchanan Valley Picnic to celebrate the end of harvest season. Over time, it grew into a beloved tradition held every fourth Saturday in August from noon to dusk. It remains a "family gathering" for many, drawing visitors from near and far as summer turns to fall.

The dining hall serves a hearty family-style meal with ham, chicken and gravy, mashed potatoes, local corn, side salads, fresh tomatoes, and homemade desserts. Volunteers prepare 800+ meals. Parishioners bake pies, cakes, and other treats, and farmers donate fresh produce. The hamburger stand offers ham salad sandwiches, burgers, hot dogs, fries, and birch beer. Other stands sell peach sundaes, floats, chicken corn soup, and drinks.

Beyond food, there's fun for all ages—games of chance, Bingo, face painting, fruit and ring toss, and live music by The Willy's and C.B. Pickers. Each year, the pastor prays for good weather and safety, reminding everyone the Picnic is more than a fundraiser—it's a celebration of unity, joy, and hospitality.

Planning starts early in the year, with most preparations occurring two weeks prior. Volunteers husk corn, clean grounds, wash dishes, and set up. The week of, cutting and cooking chickens starts at 3:00 am, potatoes peeled, and peaches sliced for sundaes. On Sunday, after cleanup, parishioners enjoy their own moment of food and fellowship.

On Thursday, August 28th our Council will hold the "Silver Rose Ceremony" in Honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Knights and the Americas. All Brothers and Parishioners are invited to attend a special prayer service in honor of Our Blessed Virgin Mary following the 5pm Mass.

Wednesday $\sim 6:00 - 7:00$ pm; or by appointment.

<u>Sacrament of the Sick</u>

Anointing of the Sick should be given if an individual is gravely ill or near death. If possible, the Sacrament should also be administered before major surgery or when one is initially hospitalized.

Sacrament of Holy Matrimony

Diocesan policy requires 12 months of preparation for Marriage. Contact the parish as soon as possible after engagement. No arrangements should be made prior to consultation with the pastor.

Sacrament of Baptism

Parents must be registered members of the parish and attend a Baptism preparation class prior to the Baptism if this is your first child baptized. Requirements for godparents are established by the Catholic Church. Please call the parish office for Information and to register your child for Baptism.
