## pastor's Notes - April 6, 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As our High Holy Days approach, I would like to share with you some of the highlights of our Holy Week Liturgies. I strongly encourage you to participate on this walk with Jesus from His Triumphant Entry into Jerusalem to His Glorious Resurrection. This is better than "Chosen" because you will not be a spectator, you will be a participant.

## **The Rites of Holy Week**

Sunday of Holy Week – April 13 – 5:00pm Saturday / Sunday 8:00am & 10:30am

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord – The first part of the Liturgy is the blessing of palms and sprinkling with Holy Water. The Passion of the Lord is proclaimed as the Gospel at this Mass. This Sunday begins the Holiest of all weeks in the Church's Liturgical Calendar.

## Monday of Holy Week - April 14 - 4:00pm

The Chrism Mass – Saint Patrick Cathedral – 212 State Street – Harrisburg

At this Liturgy the Bishop, along with the Priests of the Diocese, come together to bless the Holy Oils used in the Administration of the Sacraments throughout the year. These oils are: The Oil of Catechumens, used in Rites preparing individuals for the Sacrament of Baptism. The Oil of the Sick, used in the Rite of Anointing the Sick and Infirm. The Sacred Chrism, the oil used in the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders. Also, at this Liturgy the Priests renew their Ordination Promises.

### Wednesday of Holy Week – April 16, 2025 - 10:00am

Mass and Welcome of the Holy Oils into our Church, Blessed by the Bishop and the Presbyterate at the Mass of the Oils on Monday

### Holy Thursday – April 17 – 7:00pm

The Mass of the Lord's Supper – At this Liturgy we recall in a special way, the Institution of the Holy Eucharist. After this Mass there is a procession with the Holy Eucharist to the place of repose, reminding us of the time Jesus spent in the Garden of Gethsemane. At the conclusion of this Mass the Church prepares for Good Friday. All candles are extinguished until the lighting of the new fire at the Easter Vigil. The Holy Water is removed until the Blessing of the Easter Water at the Easter Vigil.

At this Mass the Gospel remembers that Jesus washed the feet of His disciples as an example of service and called them to do the same. We will use this optional Rite this year. Certain members of our Parish will represent the Apostles, as the Pastor washes their feet. This is a reminder that we are all called to serve each other according to the mind and heart of Jesus. This reenactment is called the "Mandatum" which is the Latin word for "Command or Mandate". The mandate Jesus gave all of us to care for each other.

## Good Friday – April 18 – 3:00pm

The Commemoration of the Lord's Passion – There are three parts to this Service. It is not a Mass, as no Mass is permitted after the Mass of the Lord's Supper until the Easter Vigil. The first part is a Liturgy of the Word, the second part is the Adoration of the Holy Cross and the third part is a Communion Service. We received the Hosts Consecrated at the Mass of the Lord's Supper the night before.

## Easter Vigil – April 19 – 8:00pm (It is forbidden to have the Vigil before dusk)

The Easter Vigil Mass – The Premier Liturgy of the year. In this Vigil there are five parts: The blessing of the new fire / the blessing, lighting and procession of the Pascal (Christ) Candle, the Liturgy of the Word, The blessing of the Easter Water, the reception of new members into the Catholic Church and into our Parish Family through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist and, finally, the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

## Easter Sunday - April 20 - 8:00am and 10:30am

Mass of the Resurrection- At this Liturgy, after the homily, all renew their Baptismal Promises and are sprinkled with the Easter Water blessed at the Easter Vigil.
