



Items to Never Leave in Your Car

Because most of us are busy with life, family and work, it can be easy to let your car become a storage space. However, it is important that you don't store certain items in your car.

- **Medication.** Extremes in temperature can cause medications to become less effective and because the temperature in our cars is rarely room temperature, it is important that you don't store medications in your car.
- **Sunscreen.** Surprisingly, the active ingredients in sunscreen breaks down in high heat leaving the sunscreen less effective. Additionally, if the sunscreen becomes too hot, the container can explode leaving a mess in your car.
- Plastic Water Bottles. Studies have shown that BPA (Bisphenol A) and phthalates are chemicals that have been found in plastic water bottles and have been linked to cancer and heart disease. Leaving a plastic water bottle in your car and allowing it to sit in the sun and heat up can cause these dangerous chemicals to leach into the water.
- Aerosol Cans. Most aerosol cans have a warning that they should not be stored in temperatures above 120° F. In the hot summer heat, the temperature inside a vehicle can rise and cause the aerosol to explode.
- Electronics. Extreme temperatures can damage electronics, don't leave them in your vehicle.
- Musical Instruments. It is best to keep your musical instruments indoors as extremes in temperature can cause warping, cracking, and other damage to musical instruments.
- Art Supplies. Crayons can melt and become a waxy mess and paint can lose its quality when stored in extreme cold and hot temperatures.
- **Prescription Glasses.** If left in a hot vehicle, the anti-reflective coating on glasses may become damaged and affect the clarity and efficiency of your prescription glasses. In cold temperatures, glasses may become brittle, making them more prone to breaking.
- **Canned Beverages.** Just like aerosol cans, canned beverages like pop (soda), beer and sparkling water are in a pressurized container. On a hot day, the liquid inside can heat up, expand and potentially explode. Not only is it dangerous, but it can leave you with a sticky mess.

It is VERY IMPOTANT to remember that children and pets should never be left in a vehicle, even for a short time!

- Young children. Sadly, in 2024, 39 children died from heatstroke when left in a vehicle. Even with a window cracked, the temperature inside a car can spike 20° F within 10 minutes. Preventive measures include: Never leave a child unattended in a vehicle. Place an item in the backseat that you will not leave behind in your vehicle (phone, purse, wallet), or install an App on your phone, like Waze, that will remind you to check the back seat when reaching your destination. Additionally, some vehicles and car seat companies offer technology that generates a tone to remind drivers of a child in the back seat.
- **Pets.** According to the American Veterinary Medical Association, hundreds of pets die every year from overheating when left in a vehicle. Tets show that even on a 70° day, the interior of a car can climb to 113° F in just one hour.
