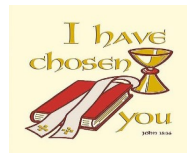

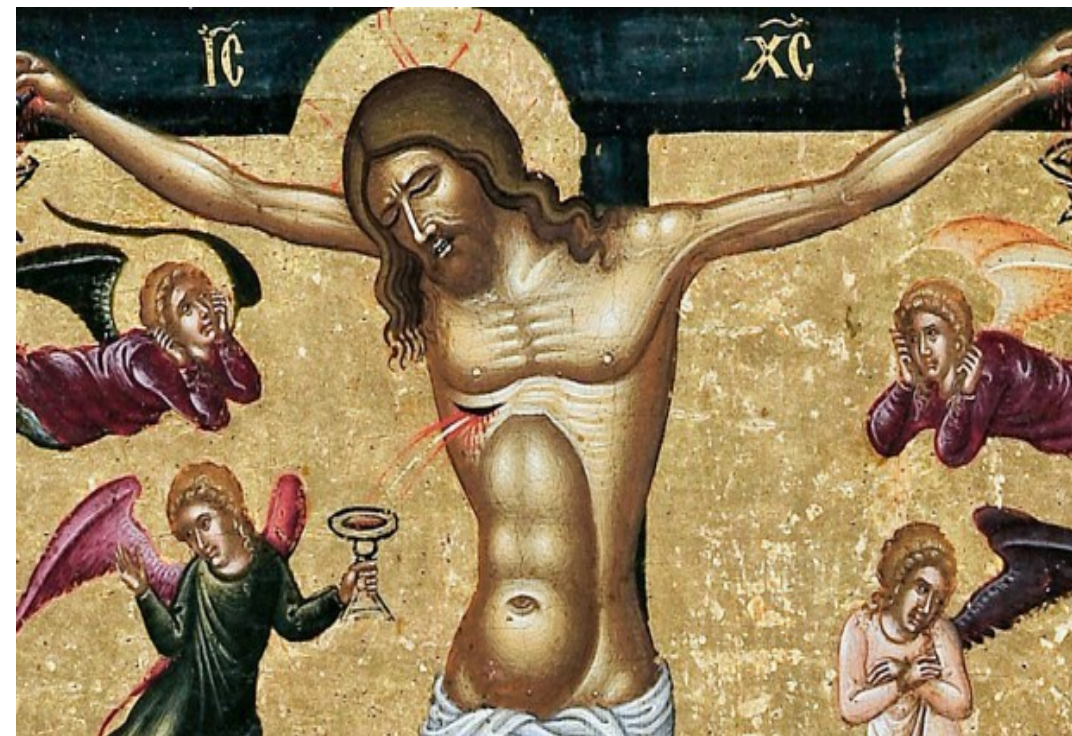

Month of the Most Precious Blood



4 Devotions to Jesus' Precious Blood you might not know

Ever since that moment the Catholic Church has been devoted to Jesus' Precious Blood, and Catholics have developed various traditions that have endured over time.

While it is not the most popular devotion in the modern history of the Church, historically it has received widespread practice. The *Directory on popular piety* lists four specific devotions that are approved by the Church and are practiced by Christians throughout the world:

- 1. CHAPLET OF THE MOST PRECIOUS BLOOD** The *Chaplet of the Most Precious Blood*, in which the seven "effusions of the Blood of Christ," implicitly or explicitly mentioned in the Gospels, are recalled in a series of biblical meditations and devotional prayers: the Blood of the Circumcision, the Blood of the Garden of Gethsemane, the Blood of the Flagellation, the Blood of the Crowning of Thorns, the Blood of the Ascent to Calvary, the Blood flowing from Christ's side pierced by the lance;
- 2. LITANY OF THE BLOOD OF CHRIST** The *Litany of the Blood of Christ*, which clearly traces the line of salvation history through a series of biblical references and passages. In its present form it was approved by the Blessed John XXIII on 24 February 1960(195);
- 3. ADORATION OF THE MOST PRECIOUS BLOOD OF CHRIST** *Adoration of the Most Precious Blood of Christ* takes a great variety of forms, all of which have a common end: adoration and praise of the Precious Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, thanksgiving for the gift of Redemption, intercession for mercy and pardon; and offering of the Precious Blood of Christ for the good of the Church;
- 4. VIA SANGUINIS** The *Via Sanguinis*: a recently instituted pious devotion, practiced in many Christian communities whose anthropological and cultural roots are African. In this devotion, the faithful move from place to place, as in the *Via Crucis*, reliving the various moments in which Christ shed his blood for our salvation.

NATURE OF POSITION

Responsible for assisting the Pastor in the overall administration of the parish finances.

REPORTING FUNCTION

Reports directly to the Pastor and parish manager.

JOB DESCRIPTION

- Advise and report to the Pastor and parish manager on all fiscal matters.
- Review, interpret and analyze monthly financial statements.
- Prepare and monitor the annual parish budgets.
- Review and approve cash receipts and accounts payable.
- Reconcile checking and savings accounts to bank statements.
- Monitor petty cash, may include surprise audits.
- Oversee the implementation of Diocesan financial policies in all areas of parish life.
- Observe guidelines and deadlines of the Diocesan accounting system.
- Complete employee time reports.
- Keep record of vacation and sick time for all parish employees.
- Ensure that parish organizations adhere to Diocesan policy.
- Complete payroll and benefits information required by the Diocesan office.
- Oversees and or coordinates the Diocesan Annual Campaign
- Report to Finance Council
- Other related tasks as assigned.

POSITION ANALYSIS

This mature, responsible individual should possess an in-depth understanding of accounting principles.

Finely honed analytical and interpretative skills will be called upon in preparing the annual budget and reviewing and monitoring financial statements and reporting on them to the parishioners. The position requires excellent communication, organizational skills.

A professional demeanor is essential in interacting with and communicating with: parishioners, members of the Finance Council, other office personnel and Diocesan Office personnel. The position requires a working background in word processing and spreadsheet applications. An understanding payroll and benefits is also desired. Must have a working knowledge of Church teaching and understanding of the mission/vision/philosophy of a Roman Catholic parish. Knowledge of a multi-site network would be helpful.

A Bachelor’s degree in accounting or equivalent work experience.

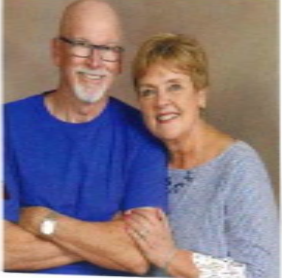

Sacrament of Penance

Saturday ~ 4:15 - 4:45 pm; or by appointment.

Sacrament of the Sick

Anointing of the Sick should be given if an individual is gravely ill or near death. If possible, the Sacrament should also be administered before major surgery or when one is initially hospitalized.

Sacrament of Holy Matrimony

Diocesan policy requires 12 months of preparation for Marriage. Contact the parish as soon as possible after engagement. No arrangements should be made prior to consultation with the pastor.

Sacrament of Baptism

Parents must be registered members of the parish and attend a Baptism preparation class prior to the Baptism if this is your first child baptized. Requirements for godparents are established by the Catholic Church. Please call the parish office for information and to register your child for Baptism.

Parish Registration

All Catholics should be registered in their local parish. Please contact the parish office to obtain registration forms, or if you are uncertain of the parish where you should register.
